His session will highlight why traditional housing development is too slow to meet demand—and how scalable, climate-resilient tiny home communities can offer bold, affordable alternatives for Canadians seeking flexible housing options.

Al Wiebe brings powerful lived experience to the housing conversation. After spending 29 months homeless and overcoming significant mental health challenges, Al became the first person with lived experience to serve as a case manager in a Canadian Housing First program. He now leads a privately funded initiative operating in three cities, housing over 800 people with a 90% retention rate. His session will explore how lived experience and private support can drive innovative, high-impact Housing First models.
